
The Club's mission is to promote and to further the enjoyment of large scale model railroading among its members, their families and their guests as well as the public at large.


The Mission of American Association of Private Railroad Car Owners is to promote the ownership, safe operation, and enjoyment of the private passenger rail car. We support the continued operation of a national network of corridor and long distance passenger trains that provide access for private railroad cars.

We have always seemed to have a love affair with trains. Not only did the railroads build America, they took travelers through their country rather than above it. The railroad passenger car represents a more relaxed and civilized time and the private car is the epitome of the elegance and grace of a bygone era.

Those days can be recreated through travel on a PV (Private Varnish.) Men and women across the country have salvaged these magnificent pieces of history from the scrap yards and brought them back to life.

AAPRCO was formed as a national trade organization in 1977 as a not-for-profit corporation. By March of 1978 there were 54 active and associate members. Membership now stands at around 550.

Three cars traveled to Chicago for the first convention in 1978. That has increased over the years. 21 cars participated in the 2016 convention special train that operated one way from Denver to Spokane.

The American Autumn Explorer is one of the few trains hosted by AAPRCO each year. Each car is independently operated by their owners but are brought together to operate as one special train. No two cars are alike nor offer the same amenities and experience. Pricing varies on accommodations and time aboard the cars. It is possible to travel on the cars to and from Vermont from their home terminals offering an extended excursion.


This leads to an old time custom on model railroads. Model railroading is a social hobby and it was a routine practice to have visiting freight cars or "private varnish" passenger cars run during open houses. This 1:1 prototype could bring back this common model railroading practice.

If you plan an open house, you could consider including an invitation to run visiting cars on your railroad.



THE BACKSHOP MODELING PROJECTS AND TIPS

This month I am taking another look at using label making tape in lieu of decals to alter a stock model into a different road name. I have a Brother label maker using .47" wide tape. Other size label makers, fonts, and multiple colors for the tape cartridges are available. Since I have a USA Trains baggage car in silver, I used silver tape to "rename" the car. The tape needs to be sealed with a clear coat. The car will still need some painting for a black roof, underframe, and trucks. The plan for this car is a battery car to power my streamline passenger train. While the Southern did not own any streamlined two door baggage cars, it looks like a good match to my other cars.



RAILROAD TRIVIA ANSWER

There have been *no operational railways in Libya since 1965*, but various lines existed in the past. Plans for a new network have been under development for some time, and in *2008 and 2009* various contracts were placed and construction work started on a 1,435 mm (4 ft 8 1/2 in) standard gauge railway parallel to the coast from the Tunisian border at Ras Ajdir to Tripoli, and on to Misrata, Sirte, Benghazi and Bayda. But, construction of a national rail system was suspended because of the *2011 Libyan civil war*.

The world's smallest country also has a railway. The Vatican City has a 300 meter long rail network including freight sidings and one railway station.


The Asheville Train Lovers Luncheons are on every 2nd Thursday of the month at the Post 25 restaurant in Arden, NC at 11:30.
